Captain Andrew’s Column

There are plenty of ‘transformation’ programmes on TV at the moment – e.g. Garden Rescue, The Repair Shop, or the ‘transformation challenge’ part of The Great British Sewing Bee. All of these programmes start with a product that is okay in itself, but needs to undergo some sort of change to make it better or more user-friendly. The same can be said of what we are looking at today. Repentance which really means restoration. We meet Jesus at the start of His earthly mission. He wanted people to be a different person, go away from what they were doing. Repent Jesus says, as He saw what was going on, but what was required to ‘repent’ was to be totally transformed or repaired; like many of the things we see in the restoration programmes. ‘Sorry seems to be the hardest word’ as Elton John sang is true. But true repentance does not mean just a ‘sorry prayer’; it is a call to re-focus on Jesus. Jesus’ call to follow can mean a complete change of direction. Do we need a change of direction and follow ‘The light of the Wrlld?’
