‘What are you giving up?’ We hear that in lent and Self Denial, we’re launching the 2023 campaign today. Lent of course was caused by people getting up and escaping and taking just what they needed to survive. Self-Denial is where we can give up or sacrifice something and donate to the many different aspects and countries that we will see in films this year. The 2023 campaign demonstrates the power of The Salvation Army’s work with young people around the world, reflecting on how The Salvation Army helps them have confidence, skills, abilities, faith and being in a community.
