**The Captain’s Column**

Elvis Presley was known as ‘The King’ but he was uncomfortable with the title. He never said he was the king. This was a title giving to him by the press, entertainers and fans. Elvis said ‘I’m just an entertainer and singer, Jesus is the real king’. This weekend we’ve been celebrating with King Charles III and his coronation. Throughout His earthly ministry Jesus taught about the Kingdom of God/Heaven. He said it is a place where things are how they should be, a place where God’s way of doing things prevails. Recently we celebrated Palm Sunday where the Bible accounts describe Jesus coming to ‘Jerusalem as King’. It seemed that Jesus was reluctant to go with that description using a Donkey to emphasise His humility and lowly status. That’s not how Kings normally behave. Jesus was of course different. He says in our Bible reading today; I have come to serve not be served.[sic] *Matt 20:28*. That’s a real challenge and as we remember this year’s Coronation, something that we should model and try to follow.
