What does the phrase self-denial  mean to you? For most of us it will  be about how much we are going to  put in our envelopes, for many  others it is about giving up a  favourite treat for Lent. I doubt if  many of us really deny ourselves  anything of much significance in  order to give. On a personal level I  am grateful that God has provided  well for me, but for all of us in  similar circumstances there is a  danger of becoming like the rich  man in the story of the widow’s  mite. While recognize everything  we have comes from God are we  tempted to feel smug or proud  about our giving when we are only  giving back a small token from  what God has already given us and  it really hasn’t cost us anything?  Mark 12:43-44 “Calling his  disciples to him, Jesus said, “Truly  I tell you, this poor widow has put  more into the treasury than all the  others. They all gave out of their  wealth; but she, out of her poverty,  put in everything—all she had to  live on.”  May we be open to God’s guidance  in our giving.</p>
