I can remember waiting on the banks of the Thames for 4-5 hours for the New Year fireworks, there was chatter, laughing even crying, but it was certainly worth the wait The Israelites had been waiting expectantly for years for their Messiah and Saviour, the story of their King had been around for a long time and this was the day, Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. He knew what was coming but was still determined to be in the City. As people saw Jesus they came spread their coats in front of him or cut branches of Palm. <i>‘Hosanna they cried, Here comes God’s King’</i> When someone famous comes ‘to town’, there’s loads of preparation; signs, police cars, road closures. When we see the celebrity, we Cheer and wave. When Jesus went into Jerusalem the crowds did the same. But a week later they shouted ‘Crucify Him!’ Palm Sunday is the start of the most important week; Passiontide. Today we celebrate, then reflect on Jesus’ sacrifice, then end with the Easter resurrection victory that gives us all eternal Hope.</p>
