I remember when Ipswich won the 1978 FA Cup, Ipswich afterwards was a sea of people cheering and celebrating, waving scarves, and flags; like last year when we got into the Premiership. When we see a crowd, we question what is going on, and want to see what or who it’s all about. This was like Jerusalem when Jesus came to town. The city was crowded with people. The biblical account of Palm Sunday is in all the Gospels indicating it’s importance. The crowd want to see a King ending the rule of the Romans. After the euphoria comes the disappointment, the crowd turns, 'Hosanna!' changes to 'Crucify him!' We’re at the start of the most significant week in the Christian Calander where we journey with Jesus on His last week ‘with us’ physically. When Jesus arrived in Jerusalem the crowds cheered, but they were fickle. A week later they shouted ‘Crucify Him!’ Palm Sunday starts with celebration, the week later goes into darkness, but we end on a high on Easter Sunday with victory giving us the eternal Hope Jesus’ resurrection gives us</p>
